Overview

The Region of Peel is issuing new funding to non-profit organizations. Formerly known as Organizational Effectiveness funding, the Capacity Fund aims to strengthen internal structures and improve an organization's ability to address social issues.

Funding available

Up to \$30,000

Priority Alignment

Projects must address one of the following three COVID-19 related priorities:

1. Support adaptive models of service delivery as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic
2. Support capacity building tools to help agencies adapt to COVID-19 related challenges
3. Addresses Systemic Discrimination:
 - This priority will address systemic discrimination and racial inequities related to COVID-19.
 - to develop policies and programs that address inequities in the Black community; Indigenous community; and People of Colour, in addition to other marginalized and equity seeking groups

Population Alignment

Projects should improve the ability of organizations to better serve Peel's priority populations:

- Collaborative groups and initiatives must be focused on actively engaging or serving marginalized and equity seeking groups.
- At-Risk Communities
- Racialized Communities
- Low Income
- Francophone Community
- Homeless/marginally underhoused
- LGBTQQIP2SAA
- Persons with Physical Disabilities/ mobility challenges



- New Immigrants and Refugees
- Victims of violence abuse and trauma

Eligible costs

- Professional fees to assist in the development or revision of organizational plans, strategies or policies
- Training costs that align to an organizational strategy; plan; policy; or process
- Succession Planning
- Development of a Performance Evaluation Framework
- Revision of HR policies
- Strategic assessment of current programs and services

The Capacity Fund will not support:

- Program development and operations
- Staff positions
- Transportation costs
- Refreshments
- Capital items
